



The Learning Program turns key research findings into practical methods for parents, empowering them to work more effectively with their children and give them a jump-start on education. At monthly classroom sessions, instruction and materials are shared with the parents, while across the hall the children work on literacy, math, occupational therapy and speech therapy skills in small groups.

DURING:

- 90% of networking is showing up. The more face-time with the group, the better.
- When you meet someone it's not about whether you will do business with that person, it's about forming a relationship and being introduced to their entire network of contacts.
- Use that pen you brought during the event to write on people's business cards things like who you'd like to introduce them to, and when you said you are going to follow up with them.

AFTER

- Act II is on you: 9 out of 10 times business is not done in that room.
- Follow up is arguably the most important step of networking so block out a portion of the day afterward to do so.
- Contacts have about the shelf-life of bananas and start to go bad after 3 days!

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ARLINGTON ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Big Is Beautiful Too

In Arlington Economic Development (AED) we pay a lot of attention to small businesses. We have the BizLaunch program of counseling and workshops (helping over 3,000 business persons annually); the ShopArlington and Concierge College programs aimed primarily at small retail and dining establishments; and the Chairman's 2011 Small Business Roundtable reforms. Our small businesses represent our local character and they are largely thought of as the "placemaking" element of economic development. However, the office market represents the majority of the commercial tax base in Arlington and it's the larger businesses that pay the bulk of the bills.



A quick analysis of data on office occupancy shows that the 105 tenants leasing over 50,000 square feet comprise 3.2 percent of all tenants but represent 52.4 percent of all leased space. The 2,435 tenants in less than 5,000 square feet comprise nearly 75 percent of all office tenants but only about 10 percent of leased space. And because the larger tenants tend to locate in the more expensive buildings, their tax contributions are greater than their proportion of space leased.

These observations are not intended to belittle the value and importance of smaller businesses, but to emphasize that retaining and recruiting large businesses is very important to our overall economic stability. When we have a major employer leave, and it happens more regularly than we would like, they are very difficult to replace. It is important to remember that large employers are vital to Arlington's success. Built-to-suit office buildings and large corporate and government tenants do represent special challenges to our development processes, however without them we would not have anywhere near the economic success we enjoy today.

How to Create Referrals

On November 30th, 22 roundtable attendees shared marketing tactics on how to create referrals to optimize a small business' outreach. It appears that the economy's slowdown is having the effect of clients being somewhat reluctant to provide referrals. This makes it even more imperative to take action to initiate the process. Here are action steps to keep the referral pipeline working for you.

- 1. Be Referable Ensure you deliver what you promise, when you promise and that it is truly value to your clients.
- 2. Have a clear description of the type of clients you are looking for and use your network effectively.
- 3. Stay Visible Unless you are continuing to work for a client, "Out of Sight, Out of Mind" becomes the operative condition. Stay in touch with your clients; drop in, brief phone call, a lunch or coffee, anything that keeps your valuable work in their mind.
- 4. Give referrals Those who give get. People who are not clients but who know the quality of your work is a large pool of potential referrals. By providing referrals to them you increase your chances of reciprocation.
- 5. Recognize and thank your referral sources.

Bottom line from the Roundtable?

Referrals are consistently identified as the most effective marketing tool to grow a company. The theme that carried throughout the discussion is "capitalize on your strengths" by asking those who know your work best to recommend you to others. Take the positive step of reminding people of the quality of your work and ask them to refer you to others.
